REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT*

TO THE GOVERNORS OF THE

JEWISH GENERAL HOSPITAL:

On behalf of your Board of Administration I have the honour to submit for your approval the Ninth Annual Report of the Hospital, for the year ended December 31st, 1942.

↑ This report which marks the Ninth Year of Service to the Community, records a new high in the number of patients to enter the Hospital in any one year. A total of 5,282 patients were admitted to the various departments of the Hospital bringing the number of patients hospitalized since its opening to 36,376. This great and growing contribution to the health of our Community must evoke a sense of pride on the part of all who have shared in making it possible. ↘

By referring to the Superintendent's Report, you will note that there has been some reduction in the number of public patients and an increase in the number of private and semi-private patients admitted during the year. This represents the experience of Hospitals throughout the continent.

In previous reports reference has been made to the necessity for enlarging our facilities in order that we may continue to meet the demands for our services. Although expansion does not appear possible to achieve under present war-time conditions, it is important that we should appreciate how urgent our needs are. More beds must be provided for patients of all classes—public, semi-private and private. Additional facilities for Laboratories, X-Ray and other technical Departments are a distinct necessity. These needs must be kept constantly before us so that when victory is ours, no time may be lost in formulating concrete plans for their realization.

I feel that mention should be made at this time of the consideration your Board of Administration has given to the establishment of a Training School for Nurses. You may recall that the original plans for our Hospital included provision for such a School. This project was dropped and I think wisely so, when authorities pointed out that there was an over supply of nurses, resulting in large scale unemployment during the depression years. Since that time the picture has changed due to many factors. Today, Hospitals throughout the Continent face a critical shortage of nursing personnel. Governmental and private agencies are carrying on intensive campaigns to stimulate the study of nursing as a career, in order that military and civilian needs may be met. Our Hospital, operating as it does with an all graduate Staff, feels the shortage keenly and your Board has explored ways and means of initiating a Training School with the least possible delay. While such a program under normal conditions requires an outlay of a considerable sum of money for the construction of an adequate Nurses' Home and training facilities, the present emergency has caused us to consider some temporary expedient capable of early accomplishment. When the many problems involved are solved, the Jewish Community of Montreal will make a further important contribution to the prestige of Jewry

throughout Canada by establishing the Dominion's first Nurses' Training School under Jewish auspices. The ability to prepare qualified young Jewish Women for the dignified professional career of nursing, is an accomplishment worthy of the efforts of any community, and I am confident that you will look with approval on this development.

At the suggestion of Dr. Mark Kaufmann, Chairman of the Medical Board's Nursing Committee, the interest of the Young Women's Hebrew Association was enlisted in offering a course for Trained Attendants. The course was given by the Association with the co-operation and practical assistance of our Hospital. The training of attendants for the care of the sick will help relieve an acute shortage of such trained personnel. We are happy to be associated with this development of the Y's vocational training program and express appreciation for their co-operation.

Although the income resulting from Hospital Operations was the highest in our history, it was inevitable that the marked increase in the cost of all items comprising the Hospital Budget, should result in a higher operating loss. The gross deficit resulting from Hospital Operations reached \$98,259.19. Net income from non-operating sources, including returns from the Combined Jewish Appeal and other sundry donations, totaled \$99,370.89, resulting in a surplus of \$1,111.70. This favourable result was due to the success of the first Combined Jewish Appeal when the Community responded so generously to the increased needs of the Hospital.

The soundness of joint fund raising was again demonstrated during the year when the second Combined Jewish Appeal was brought to such a successful conclusion. We should like, at this time, to record our deepest appreciation to Mr. Monroe Abbey, under whose capable leadership the Appeal met with so generous a response. Our thanks are equally due to all those who were a part of the Campaign Organization for the effective manner in which they executed their various assignments and co-ordinated their efforts.

The necessity for accumulating a substantial Endowment Fund has been referred to from year to year. As the Hospital grows in importance and members of our Community gain a truer appreciation of the value of its service, there comes the gratifying assurance that this means of providing for its financial security is being given wider recognition. in safeguarding the high standards of the scientific work carried on by the Hospital. To Dr. Alton Goldbloom, Chairman of the Medical Board, and to his Associates, we extend our thanks and appreciation. In addition to the direct application of medical knowledge to the care of the sick, the Medical Staff continues to engage actively in clinical research and has participated in numerous educational activities to improve the professional knowledge of our physicians and intern staff. The Clinical-Pathological Conferences continue to be well attended by members of the staff and other physicians of the Community. X-Ray, Electro-cardiography and other specialized conferences are participated in by large numbers of the staff. The Tumor Clinic, continues to be extremely active and is making important contributions to the handling of the many cases of cancer which are seen in the Hospital. Daily rounds and periodic staff conferences of the various departments are educational activities of the highest importance to the development of the younger physicians. The medical literature continues to receive liberal contributions from the members of the staff. All these activities have established the Jewish General Hospital as the centre of education for our physicians and add immeasurably to the pride of our people and prestige of the Community.

We wish them God speed and look forward to their early and safe return.

It is always a pleasure for me to refer with gratitude to the role which the Women's Auxiliary continues to play in helping to keep our Hospital in the front rank of the Dominion's Institutions. Ever alert to our needs, the Auxiliary has broadened its organization so that all groups and ages are combined to serve the Hospital. The recently organized Juniors have through their outstanding contribution of voluntary service to the Hospital, given ample indication of how potent a force this group of young girls is yet to become. The voluntary service which the Women of the Auxiliary and the Juniors render, has enabled us to carry on, when we otherwise might have been compelled to restrict our services.

Through the initiative of the Auxiliary, our Hospital has undertaken the training of V. A. D.'s in co-operation with the Canadian Red Cross Society. A class of more than 30 girls and young women is completing courses in Nursing and First Aid. A period of supervised ward work follows, after which the trainee becomes available for voluntary service in Hospitals. This activity is a distinct contribution to our war effort which is of utmost importance to the Home Front.

The Life Saving Fund of the Auxiliary is of such importance that special mention must be made of the manner in which the women of Montreal continue to respond to its needs. The ever growing list of Patronesses, who support this Fund, is a tribute to their humanity and generosity. The Board of Administration has undertaken to give recognition to the Patronesses of the Life Saving Fund and others who

have given distinguished service to the Auxiliary, by erecting in the entrance foyer of the Hospital a Tablet to their honour. This Honour Roll, which will soon adorn the walls of the Hospital, will constitute tangible evidence of the Board of Administration's deep appreciation and high regard for the contributions and achievements of this outstanding organization. Once again I desire to express to Mrs. Alton Goldbloom, the President of the Auxiliary, our sincere gratitude for her capable leadership and deep personal interest in the problems of the Hospital. To the Executive, Officers, Committees and Membership at large, we owe our heartfelt thanks for their continued interest and warmhearted co-operation.

Last year we referred to the need for increasing the allowance made by the Province of Quebec for the care of indigent patients. We are happy to report that the Provincial Government has increased the per diem allowance from \$2.00 to \$3.00 per day. The new rate became effective August 1st. We desire to express our appreciation to the Honorable Mr. Henri Groulx, Minister of Health and Social Welfare, and to his Government, for their understanding of the Hospital's problems.

I should like to record once again my appreciation to the members of the Boards of Administration and Trustees and to the various Committees for their keen interest and active participation in the affairs of the Hospital.

Our thanks are due to our legal advisors, Messrs. Weinfield and Rudenko and to Mr. H. E. Hershorn, Honorary Notary who have given us service without fee. We record our gratitude to the Jewish Public Library for continuing to make their facilities available to our patients.

The English and Jewish Press have given us generously of their space and we thank them heartily for their co-operation.

The Medical, Nursing, Technical and other Staffs have all been working under the handicaps imposed by present conditions. That they have assumed their difficult tasks without complaint is a tribute to their loyalty. We should like them to know that their efforts have not gone unrecognized. The Superintendent, Mr. S. S. Cohen, and his Administrative Staff have had many difficult problems to deal with. That the Hospital's services were so adequately maintained under most trying conditions is in no small measure due to their zeal and devotion. We tender them gladly this expression of our appreciation and thanks.

The shape of things to come is difficult to foretell. There is, however, a definite trend toward social legislation, calculated to make the post-war world a better place to live in. Here in Canada, there are strong indications that National Health Insurance may become a reality. The ultimate effect of such a scheme on the voluntary hospital can hardly be foreseen. There will be changes and some of them may be of a radical nature. The ability of the voluntary Hospital to adjust itself to communal needs, will stand it in good stead. Our Hospitals, nobly conceived and guided with vision and high purpose, will blaze new trails to a better world.

Gentlemen:

A contingent liability in respect of the issue of \$300,000.00 of 5% Serial Debentures, due 1932-1951, by the Jewish Hospital Campaign Committee Inc., and guaranteed as to principal and interest by the Government of the Province of Quebec, remains outstanding to the amount of \$171,000.00.

Your Statement of Income and Expenses on Hospital Operations for the year 1942 indicates a net operating loss of \$98,259.19.

Net Non-Operating Income for the year 1942 represented by contributions to Maintenance Funds, Investment Income, Donations, Memberships, etc., amounted to \$99,370.89.

Net Income from pledges to Building Fund during the year 1942 amounted to \$13,067.17.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT*

MR. ALLAN BRONFMAN, *President*,
JEWISH GENERAL HOSPITAL, MONTREAL.
Sir:

I have the honour to submit for your approval the Ninth Annual Report of the Superintendent for the year ended December 31st, 1942.

During the past twelve months our Hospital was called upon to render the greatest volume of service in its history. Patients admitted totaled 5,282, an increase of 402 over admissions for the previous year. Days of treatment totaled 63,013. The average length of stay in the Hospital for patients of all classes was reduced from 12.9 days last year to 11.9 days. This trend toward a shorter hospital stay is indicative of the tremendous pressure under which the Hospital operated throughout the year. The urgent demand for space necessitated the discharge of patients as soon as they no longer needed active medical care in order that more acutely ill patients could be admitted. This situation prevailed in the private and semi-private categories as well as in the public wards. Comparison and classification of admissions and days of treatment with figures for the previous year follow:

The further reduction in the number of public patients hospitalized and corresponding increase in private and semi-private admissions, reflects the improved economic conditions.

After many years of representations to the Provincial Government, the Hospitals were granted an increase in the rate paid for indigent patients admitted under the Quebec Public Charities Act. The increased rate of \$3.00 per day, which became effective in August of this year, afforded the Hospitals some relief from the considerable financial burden resulting from the care of indigents, and we are grateful for this added support of our work. We in common with other Hospitals of the City are still compelled, however, to carry entirely free a large number of patients who fail to qualify as indigents according to the arbitrary standards set by the Department of Social Welfare of the City of Montreal. During the year under review, we wrote off approximately 2,000 days of treatment given to patients who fall into this category, thus resulting in a loss to the Hospital of some \$6,000.00 in revenue to which it is justly entitled. The City Authorities must recognize that, although unemployment has practically disappeared, there remains a large number of persons with incomes barely sufficient for the necessities of life. This group cannot undertake the payment of Hospital bills even for short illnesses.

The Out-Patient Department recorded 29,507 visits during the year, a decrease of 2,331 visits from the attendance for last year. This somewhat lessened activity further reflects the increased earning power of the population. It must be emphasized, however, that those patients who attend, contribute but a fraction of the actual cost of their treatment and the Out-Patient Department accounts for a considerable portion of the Hospital's deficit. The average revenue per visit was only 12 cents as against a cost per visit of over \$1.00. The Provincial and Municipal Authorities should take cognizance of this situation and relieve the Hospitals of at least part of this burden.

The institutional mortality rate rose slightly from 2% to 2.2%.

Operations totaled 3,103, an increase of 52 over the Year 1941.

All Departments participated in and contributed to the markedly increased activities of the entire Hospital. Reference will be made to a few of the highlights.

The Obstetrical Department recorded a total of 990 births for the year, an increase of 159. It is again a matter of extreme gratification to be able to report that this large number of deliveries was accomplished without the occurrence of a maternal death. This excellent record is a tribute to the close supervision and co-operation of all members of the Obstetrical Staff. The handling of such a large number of patients in the limited space available was not without its problems. Peak loads over extended periods of time necessitated the placing of patients in examining and waiting rooms, bringing forcibly to our attention the urgent need for additional space.

The part played by the Laboratories in the diagnosis and treatment of the patient grows in importance each year. Techniques are becoming more complicated and procedures more numerous. We have kept pace with all new developments and the Department of Laboratories handled a large volume of work under the handicap of inadequate space referred to in previous reports. The shortage of interns, who in normal times, carried out certain clinical laboratory procedures, has necessitated the employment of additional technicians. It is hoped that this measure will be only a temporary expedient so that when the situation is relieved, interns will resume this work, not only in the interests of economy, but because it contributes to their better training.

The X-Ray Department continues to be extremely active and here too, there is urgent need for additional space.

The Department of Urology has been deprived of its Chief when Dr. Max Ratner enlisted in the Royal Canadian Army Medical Corps. Upon the recommendation of Dr. Ratner and the Medical Board, Drs. A. Stilman and A. Strasberg were promoted to the rank of Associates and jointly share the responsibility for the Department in Dr. Ratner's absence.

The Medical Board under the Chairmanship of Dr. Alton Goldbloom has been keenly alert in meeting all the problems related to the medical and scientific activities of the Hospital. I am indebted to Dr. Goldbloom and to the members of the Board for their helpful co-operation.

The critical situation which confronted us with regard to the shortage of skilled and unskilled help, has been and continues to be our greatest problem. The Armed Forces and the lure of higher wages paid by the industries has stripped the market of all available help. Salaries have been increased, but Hospitals are in no financial position to compete with industry and in consequence cannot retain their staffs. National Selective Service has been most helpful in its attitude, but is limited in any assistance it can offer due to inequality of salaries paid by Hospitals. The solution seems to lie in a freezing order of some nature with subsidies to help the Hospitals make up the differential in wages.

The Nursing Department was most handicapped due to a real shortage of nurses. The creation of a Training School, which while not offering immediate relief, and surrounded with many problems, is nevertheless a project which should be pursued with the greatest energy. Voluntary assistants and trained aids relieved the nurses of some of the non-technical routine and thus made them available for the important nursing procedures.

The Dietary Department suffered heavily from inadequate staff. That it was able to meet the needs of patients and staff and maintain, to a high degree, its usual standards, is a tribute to the loyal group which has worked and continues to work without thought of self throughout this difficult period. There is urgent need for replacement of our dishwashing equipment, which after almost ten years of hard use, is not performing effectively. Application for the necessary priority to purchase has been made and approval is expected. The cost of new equipment is estimated at \$5,000.00.

The buildings, mechanical equipment and grounds were maintained efficiently without undue cost. Towards the close of the year, arrangements were completed for the burning of coal as fuel, in compliance with an order of the Fuel Oil Controller, by the installation of a mechanical stoker under one boiler and the conversion of a second boiler for hand-firing. Our experience with coal during the past winter has been satisfactory, although the present price of coal does not permit any saving as compared with oil as fuel.

Our farm has again served to produce large quantities of vegetables at considerable saving in cost. In these days of Victory Gardens, our farm project becomes not only a measure of economy, but a distinct contribution to our war effort by increasing food production.

A brief summary of the financial situation should prove to be of interest. Expenditures, which include a provision for depreciation and replacements of \$15,000.00, totaled \$371,593.78. This represents an increase of \$29,464.55 over the expenditures for last year. The increase is accounted for by the higher cost of services and by the advance in the price of many foods and supplies.

Revenue from Hospital operations totaled \$273,334.59, an increase of \$25,194.01 over the income for the Year 1941. The higher income is the result of the larger number of private and semi-private patients treated as well as of the advanced rate paid for Q.P.C.A. patients from August 1st. The net deficit

resulting from hospital operations was \$98,259.19, or higher by \$4,260.54 than the loss for the previous year. Income from the Combined Jewish Appeal and other non-operating sources totaled \$99,370.89, thus resulting in a net surplus for the year of \$1,111.70.

The per capita cost, for all patients based on charging all operating costs to in-patients, rose to \$5.66 per day as compared with \$5.43 for 1941.

The Women's Auxiliary continues to render outstanding and invaluable service. It has maintained all its usual obligations and has assumed new responsibilities. That the Auxiliary's support of the Hospital is not limited by any narrow concepts, is demonstrated by its recent undertaking to defray the cost of engaging a Social Service worker to be attached to the Tumor Clinic. This will add immeasurably to the effectiveness of the Tumor Clinic's work. I should like to add a word of profound appreciation to the Women of the Auxiliary and to the Juniors for their magnificent voluntary service. Whether our need was in the kitchen to help with canning and preserving, in the dining rooms, on the wards, the making of dressings or for many other duties, they have responded with enthusiasm. I should like them all to know that their services are highly appreciated. To Mrs. Alton Goldbloom, I again express my gratitude for her constant co-operation. To the various Committees, Executive and Membership at large, I extend my warm thanks.

The Employees Health Service under the direction of Dr. David L. Mendel has been extremely active in the routine periodic examination of all members of the Staff and in the care of those who fell ill. This task involved a great deal of work on the part of Dr. Mendel and his Staff, who at great personal sacrifice, gave up much of their time in making visits to the homes of employees as well as seeing them in the Hospital. All members of the Staff rendered service cheerfully when called upon to do so, and we are deeply grateful for their valuable assistance.

To members of the Board of Administration and Board of Trustees, I convey my appreciation for their assistance and co-operation. May I, again express to you, Mr. President, my profound thanks and admiration for your deep interest and understanding advice.

The year covered by this Report was both the most active and the most difficult in the history of our Hospital. The problems were many and at times appeared to be insurmountable. While the conditions under which we were compelled to work prevented us from doing all the things we should like to have done, I feel nevertheless, that we may look back on our accomplishments of the year with justifiable pride. The ability to render effective service in the face of difficulties to which only the slightest reference has been made in this Report, is not the result of chance. Our Hospital has been endowed with that priceless possession of any organization—the loyalty and devotion of its workers.

To all the members of our Staff who by their self-sacrifice have made possible this record of service, I express my sincerest appreciation for their constant devotion.

The exigencies of the times may compel us to revise our concepts of Hospital service. Some of the so called luxuries which patients have come to expect in the Hospital, may disappear in order that all efforts may be concentrated in rendering those services essential to the recovery of the patient. We must not, however, adopt an attitude of defeatism. We must have faith. Faith in the work we are doing. Faith in our employees. Faith in our friends. And above all, faith in the future which we face with the hope that it will bring us moral sustenance and material security.

REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT*

FELLOW-MEMBERS:—

In these days of struggle for a better world, when we are striving to maintain human values and to build an improved social order, it is gratifying to present the following record of the united efforts of the Women's Auxiliary. To-day's report marks the culmination of seven years of services to the Jewish General Hospital, and is our contribution, however limited, to better health and happiness. The impact of the lengthening war has stirred us to greater effort to build for victory. What more practical approach than directing our energies towards improving the health of the nation when life is being so rapidly destroyed on other fronts?

Our financial statement for 1942 shows a total income of \$16,143.62, of which \$4,144.00 is specifically in payment of dues for 1943 and therefore, cannot rightfully be applied to the records of this report. Thus our income from all sources for 1942 is \$11,999.62 and our expenditure for the hospital is \$11,830.54. I must further point out that our treasurer's report deals with monies received and expended in 1942, while our chairmen's records are concerned with income for 1942 without regard for the date on which it was received. This will explain the variance in the amounts shown. I shall now proceed to give you a resume as to income, disbursement, and the function of our committees, and at the same time pay tribute to those who combined to make this report possible.

Mrs. Allan Bronfman, as chairman of the Life-Saving Fund, has by an intensive personal service, accomplished the remarkable result of an increase of 31 per cent in the number of subscribers over the previous year. During 1942 there were 186 Patronesses, who contributed the magnificent sum of \$4,786.00 to the Life-Saving Fund. Donations received amounted to \$405.98, making the grand total of \$5,191.98. Having consistently devoted herself to the medical needs of the sick poor in our hospital, Mrs. Bronfman has reached out to all who might lend a sympathetic ear to her appeal. She has sown the seed of understanding in the hearts of the generous. Thus the sick, irrespective of race or creed, are deriving the benefits of a new opportunity for life and usefulness. It is our proud record that we have been able to meet all requisitions for blood transfusions, oxygen, serum, special drugs, special nursing and every life-saving measure. We have also supplied much life-saving scientific equipment, and are making annual contributions of \$800.00 to the obstetrical clinics for vitamins and \$265.00 for insulin for clinic patients and all from the Life-Saving Fund. We compliment Mrs. Allan Bronfman as a shining example of devotion to a noble cause and we pay tribute to our Patronesses for their inspiring response in support of a work that is so close to all our hearts. For the many donations to the Life-Saving Fund we extend our warmest appreciation and our grateful thanks. Mrs. David Tannenbaum has earned our gratitude for faithfully maintaining the records, and to her and all who lent encouragement to this work, we offer our sincere thanks.

Mrs. M. J. Raff as chairman of membership, continues to give distinguished service in the maintain-

ance of a large active organization. This, on the seventh year of our existence, is marked by an excellent increase in our senior membership. Our records show that 1923 members inclusive of Patronesses paid their dues in 1942, together with 38 out-of-town associates. We only begin to evaluate Mrs. Raff's contribution to our hospital services, when we appreciate the greatness of her responsibility in planning and directing the collection of dues from so large a membership. I feel a sense of personal indebtedness to Mrs. Raff, for hers has been not only an unwavering faithfulness to duty, but a maintained interest in our growth and usefulness that has been decidedly heartening. We extend to her the appreciation that she richly deserves. Without the funds of more than \$5,000.00 raised from senior membership dues, we could not have provided linens, silver replacements, medical books, an instrument fund, kitchen equipment, and the many needs that must be supplied. We thank our membership for their continued response and support to our efforts; they are our incentive and strength.

Mesdames Samuel Leopold, Harry Singer and Wm. Riven carried the responsibility of fund-raising, together with Mrs. Simon Rubin as treasurer, Mrs. S. Hershon and Miss Phyllis Fitch (now Mrs. Samuel Farber) as secretaries and a large group of devoted workers. Thanks to their combined enthusiastic devotion, the culminating event, a Donor Luncheon, was marked by a most noteworthy success. The handsome sum of \$3,590.85 was raised, and I had the privilege of presenting to the President of the hospital, Mr. Allan Bronfman, a cheque for \$3,018.00 for the establishment of a Blood and Plasma Bank. The President, in turn, presented me with a plaque on behalf of the auxiliary, bearing the following inscription which will be placed on the door of the Blood and Plasma Bank: "A Tribute Everlasting to the Women's Auxiliary of the Jewish General Hospital through whose generosity the Blood and Plasma Bank was established. May 1942." The Chairmen, treasurer, secretaries, and all who worked and contributed towards this magnificent result deserve our gratitude for adding another page in the book of good deeds of the Women's Auxiliary.

At this time of writing, owing to priorities, the necessary equipment has not been available for the establishment of this aid to life-saving. However, the Blood and Plasma Bank will be established as soon as may be possible. In the meantime all patients are being provided with their needs through the Life-Saving Fund.

Mrs. David Tannenbaum, our publicity chairman, merits our gratitude for her consistent attention to keeping our work before the public. Her loyalty is valued greatly, for here is an attention to duty that is ever dependable. Nor are her energies limited to the service of her own department, but always available in the interests of hospital welfare. Mrs. Tannenbaum's loyalty calls forth our highest esteem. We herewith extend our most grateful thanks to the Montreal Star, Gazette, Canadian Jewish Chronicle, Canadian Jewish Review, The Eagle, The Herald, The Monitor and the Westmount Examiner for the valued space they have always given us. We are

appreciative of their generous co-operation and encouragement in our endeavours.

Mrs. Victor Michaels, our treasurer, and Miss Dorothy Hart, our financial secretary, give to the task of handling our finances an efficiency and attention that is both an inspiration to behold and a comfort to contemplate. It is our proud boast that in the hands of the keepers of our pursestrings we have found the ideal combination of faithfulness and scrupulous attention to detail. Without such devotion and intelligent handling, the burden of my own responsibilities would be increased a hundredfold. I extend to Mrs. Michaels and Miss Hart the gratitude that such fine devotion deserves and express the hope that we may have their services for many years to come.

Mrs. L. K. Freedman, our recording secretary, and Mrs. George Streat and Mrs. Z. I. Diner, our corresponding secretaries, add their valuable contribution of services to round out and co-ordinate the efforts of the officers on behalf of the hospital. Mrs. Freedman maintains a record of our activities in a manner that will remain a fine document and at the same time store up interesting history for the future. Mrs. Streat's duties have been varied; she sent 108 letters on both happy and sad occasions and has attended to arrangements for meetings. I have been particularly appreciative of her gracious response to the call of duty. Mrs. Diner carries a responsibility of considerable proportion in caring for the printing needs of all departments; all notices of meetings come under her supervision, and she both sends and directs the mailing of notices. It is no small task for our secretaries to maintain their responsibilities, and I would assure Mesdames Freedman, Streat and Diner that we are keenly aware of their devotion and extend to them a sincere expression of our high regard and appreciation. We would also extend our warmest thanks to Mrs. Max Rabinovitch and Mrs. Sam Gasco, (who has undertaken the chairmanship of clerical services) for their helpful assistance in the addressing and mailing of notices for general meetings.

Mrs. A. M. Wener, Mrs. J. Greenberg, and our new co-chairman, Mrs. M. Greenblatt, have looked after the linen purchasing needs of the hospital. Supplies for linen requirements have been increasingly difficult to obtain. It has entailed a tremendous expenditure of energy in an effort to fill the requisitions most urgently required. The cost of our purchases was \$2,356.73. Thanks to the resourcefulness of our chairmen, by searching far and wide, the immediate need was supplied. Mesdames Wener, Greenberg and Greenblatt appreciate to the full how vital is an adequate supply of linens to meet all emergencies in the hospital. We, in turn, know that our chairmen are alert to the importance of their department to hospital efficiency. They have ever given it their utmost care and attention. We would extend to them our gratitude and appreciation for their unfailing interest and devotion. I also desire to thank Mrs. Greenblatt for her gracious attention to our members at general meetings.

Mrs. J. Rubin and Mrs. J. Schulman, the co-chairmen of our Children's Nursery Fund, present a record that gladdens all our hearts. With an infant and children's membership of 1,025, each of whom contributes one dollar annually, with the addition of some small donations, they report an income of

\$1,119.00. Their expenditures amounted to \$1,045.71 made up as follows: \$450.00 for drugs and supplies for the non-paying newborns; \$503.50 for a Castle Humidicrib, an invaluable asset in the care of the premature infant; \$56.49 for layettes and \$35.72 for stationery, stamps and other minor expenses. Our co-chairmen are enthusiastically devoted to the growth and needs of their department. The results are evidenced in the above report and demonstrate a faithfulness of purpose that can be measured in terms of success accomplished. We extend to Mrs. Rubin and Mrs. Schulman the deep and warm-hearted appreciation of all to whom the needs of a sick child are so distinctly moving. On behalf of the babies who are the beneficiaries, we express to our members and to those who responded to the call for service, the gratitude of the Women's Auxiliary. I would here remind you that the benefits given to the little patients in the hospital are limited to the extent of your response. Therefore I would urge you to enroll your children, grandchildren, nieces and nephews in our Children's Nursery Fund and so help us to give the children every advantage for a healthy start in life.

Mrs. Jack Klein, chairman of the Layette Committee reports that 20 babies were supplied with layettes during the past year, each bundle containing 2 dozen diapers, 2 sweaters, 2 pairs booties, 3 nighties, 2 bonnets, 2 shirts and 2 blankets. \$85.49 was expended for supplies, of which \$29.00 was donated by the following ladies to whom we make grateful acknowledgment; Mrs. Marshall's group; Mrs. H. B. Prinsky, Mrs. Sam Klein, Mrs. Gene Kruger, Mrs. A. Mailman, and Mrs. Jack Klein. We also extend sincere thanks to Mesdames M. Marshall, M. O. Kirsch, R. Caplan, Lawrence Cohen, John Loebel, Stanley Vineberg, Archie Jacobs, W. Hyman, J. Kupfer, Ben Marks, Max Fineberg, Albert Wener, Harry Cohen and Miss Sophia Hirsch for the knitting of 50 sweaters, 75 pairs of booties and 35 bonnets. Without the devoted care of our chairmen and the good-will and co-operation of the many kind friends, we could not send our needy babies out into a cold world adequately clothed. We would give assurance to Mrs. Klein of our appreciation of her attention to the needs of the infants.

Mrs. M. Gordon as chairman of the Bottle and Jar collection committee records the gathering of 66,966 bottles and jars, which realized \$561.17 and entailed \$202.29 for cartage expense, leaving a net balance of \$358.88. While the returns do not measure up to the results obtained in the previous year, nevertheless appreciation is more deserved by Mrs. Gordon for the success accomplished in the face of a combination of circumstances which has handicapped the operation of this worth-while undertaking begun six years ago. We wish to give assurance to Mrs. Gordon that her continued devotion to her department has our hearty support and encouragement and to assure her that better days are in the offing. In extending our gratitude to Mrs. Gordon, we wish also to give thanks to Mesdames S. Richer, M. Cohen, L. Brodie and S. Witten for their helpfulness in taking calls, and to Mr. M. Browns for his continued generous co-operation in carrying the expense of half the cartage. I wish to particularly stress the need for a greater response on the part of our membership in the collection of bottles and jars for the benefit of the hospital.

Mrs. Moe Segal, chairman of our Women's Auxiliary Juniors, presents a most encouraging account of the creation and development of a new type of membership in 1942. Realizing as we did, that a gap existed between our senior and nursery fund members, we decided to reach out to young unmarried women between the ages of sixteen and thirty and enlist their interest and co-operation in our activities. Mrs. Segal arranged a series of supper meetings at her home which bore excellent fruit and resulted in the enrolment of 250 members paying an annual fee of \$1.00. Thanks to our chairman's wise guidance and interest in furthering the growth and development of this force for good, we can look to our Juniors to provide the nucleus for leaders for the parent group in due course. The Juniors held four general and twelve executive meetings. At these meetings, much appreciated and stimulating addresses were delivered by Mr. S. S. Cohen, Dr. George Strean, Miss Faye Fox, Miss Elise Bercovitch and Dr. Frank Pedley. The hospital provided two courses in Home Nursing and St. John's Ambulance First Aid which were attended by large groups. Two fine contributions were made by our Juniors: \$25.00 to the Blood and Plasma Bank and \$25.00 to our Medical Library Fund. They have also given voluntary aid in the wards during the past year. I am delighted to report that our Juniors have undertaken the monetary responsibility of \$250.00 for the Medical Library in 1943. The Executive Board of the Women's Auxiliary Juniors are as follows: President, Miss Beatrice Kirsch; vice-presidents, Miss Ruth Tannenbaum, Miss Shirley Brainin, Miss Maytie Deitcher, Miss Ethel Nadler; record-secretary, Miss Nory Lowey, assistant, Miss Reva Ein; correspondence secretary, Miss Muriel Block; assistant, Miss Sylvia Tepner; treasurer, Miss Martha Pesner, assistant, Miss Lillian Brown. We extend to the officers and members of the Juniors the expression of our high regard and assurance of our appreciation and high hopes for their increased assistance in the future. We are glad to note that much stimulation was given to the membership campaign by the awards made by the Women's Auxiliary and won by the Misses Nery Lowey, Shirley Brainin and Anabelle Geffin. Mrs. Segal is to be congratulated on the success of this undertaking and we express our high hopes for the growth of our Junior Body in 1943.

Mrs. M. A. Simon presents a splendid report of the growth and usefulness of the Medical library. A well equipped library of scientific works is invaluable to the medical staff and a requisite of a first-ranking hospital. Our grant of \$250.00 together with donations amounting to \$232.00 has permitted the hospital to maintain subscriptions to medical journals amounting to \$126.54, while \$149.62 has been expended on 17 medical books. Other books on order will be taken care of by available funds. We make grateful acknowledgement for the following donations given in tribute to the blessed memory of dear departed and honouring those who celebrated happy events. Mrs. Samuel Bronfman, \$10.00; Mrs. Max Usher, \$5.00; The Ballon Family, \$25.00; Mrs. M. J. Raff, \$20.00; Miss Frances Kellert, \$10.00; Friends of the late Mrs. T. Percy Hirsch, \$67.00; Mrs. M. B. Nevard of New York City, \$25.00; Women's Auxiliary Juniors, \$25.00; Mr. and Mrs. Samuel Bronfman, \$25.00; and Dr. and Mrs. Harry C. Ballon, \$20.00.

We give assurance to Mrs. Morris Simon, our chairman, that her dependability and faithful devotion to the needs of the Medical Library is a contribution that is a distinct force for good. To the members of her committee, we extend sincere appreciation.

The surgical dressings chairmen, Mesdames Simon Rubin, Samuel Held, Karl Druckman, M. I. Messinger, Arthur Friedman and B. Wigdor, report an attendance of 1,029 visits made to the hospital in the making of 240,855 dressings. Until tea rationing came into effect, tea was served and \$45.00 collected. In these days of shortage of staff, the service rendered by our chairmen and the groups preparing these dressings has assumed an added importance for the hospital. Hence to the chairmen I extend a sincere expression of our regard for their valued services and would assure them of their importance to hospital welfare. To the ladies who assist them we offer a sincere vote of thanks.

Mrs. Jack Fitch and Mrs. Ned Gross as co-chairmen of telephone service call forth our grateful appreciation for their graciousness in serving with a smile. Always faithful to their duties, I must extend to them my own thanks for their dependability in facilitating our meetings.

Mrs. Mendel Segal has had the responsibility of arranging for speakers. Hers has been no easy task in these days of stress and turmoil. We are indebted to her for a faithful attention and would assure Mrs. Segal that her co-operation has not passed unnoticed. It is gratifying to record that Mrs. Mendel Segal and Mrs. E. Lozinski will jointly carry the responsibility for our programmes in 1943.

We extend to Mrs. H. Levine our sincere thanks for maintaining our attendance records. Her co-operation is very much appreciated.

The members of the Board are deserving of the highest praise for their support of our committees and the maintenance of our membership. Without their loyalty and devotion we could not present as excellent a record for 1942. In these days when voluntary service becomes a more urgent hospital need, we are grateful for the response that has been made. Were it not for the service rendered by both members of the Board and the general membership, the task of canning during the summer could not have been accomplished. To all who gave service I would extend our most grateful thanks and assure them of our sincere appreciation for rallying to the call of the hospital. I would give assurance particularly to those ladies who are not members of our board, that their services during the summer and since has not been unnoticed and that we are always grateful for their generous response.

Voluntary aid for the wards and dining-room was organized in the autumn under the co-chairmanship of Mrs. H. Singer and Mrs. Wm. Riven to meet the acute need caused by the shortage of staff. It became evident that an auxiliary office and telephone installation would have to be arranged in the hospital to handle the service adequately. This was done and a worker placed in charge. I am glad to report that the hospital is receiving much appreciated assistance which at this time of writing is being co-ordinated into a more dependable effort. Our workers are distinguished by the wearing of a white smock and an arm band denoting volunteer worker. We express sincere appreciation to Mrs. Singer and Mrs. Riven

for their co-operation in this undertaking. While the office was primarily set up to meet the present emergency need, all our activities are being directed there.

I would express the sincere regret of the officers and members of the board in accepting the following resignations. Mrs. J. Greenberg served faithfully and well for six and a half years as one of the chairmen of the linen purchasing committee and resigned because of ill-health. Mrs. Sam Hershon as chairman of our clerical committee gave a very devoted service but found herself otherwise engaged. Mrs. Philip Vineberg as first chairman of the Medical Library organized the service and we extend to her our warm appreciation. She was unable to continue owing to her university studies. Mrs. A. Usher as chairman of Car Service relinquished her post on account of the unavailability of cars. It is also with regret that we accepted the following resignations from our board of directors: Mesdames Norman Viner, Saul Yanow, S. J. Usher, J. I. Stampleman, H. C. Sabloff, J. Rosenstein, Harold Rittenberg, A. Raginsky, Sr., Myron Notkin, Charles Liebman, Mark Kaufmann, S. Kahn, I. Glickman, F. Caplan and B. Albert. We gratefully acknowledge the services they have rendered and express the hope that when health and leisure permit, they will again actively join our forces.

We contemplate with much satisfaction the list of speakers of note at our general meetings. They provided us with much food for thought and interest. Mr. L. S. B. Shapiro, the well-known columnist, now overseas, spoke to us on the "Roosevelt-Churchill Partnership;" Miss Constance Hope of New York, author of "Publicity in Broccoli" presented us with an account of publicity as it is practised; Mr. S. S. Cohen, our Superintendent introduced a most impressive film, "White-Battalions serving all Mankind;" Mme. Max Nordau addressed our Donor Luncheon audience on "Modern Drama and Its Relation to Real Life;" and Professor Forrest La Violette gave us an enlightening address on "Social Reconstruction and Family Life."

The children in the hospital were again made happy at Chanukah when we presented them with toys. We are indebted to Mrs. Simon Rubin and Mrs. Samuel Held for making so splendid a selection in their purchases and I am very grateful for their gracious co-operation.

The task of maintaining our activities for the hospital has been great but we have endeavoured to service as many war activities as possible. We organized under the chairmanship of Mrs. Samuel Yaphe a V Bundles group. They have given excellent service and have won the high commendation of those in authority. As our representative, Mrs. Yaphe and her committee have been held in high esteem and have reflected well on the Women's Auxiliary. We extend to Mrs. Yaphe the assurance of our appreciation and would ask her to convey to the ladies of her group our pleasure in their good deeds. The Jewish Branch of the Canadian Red Cross Society had the co-operation of our surgical dressings groups over a period of some weeks when they helped to prepare utility bags for air-raid victims. We are represented on the Women's Division of the War Efforts Committee and are co-operating with the Wartime Prices and Trade Board. Mrs. Allan Bronfman, jr., as our representative took charge of the provision of refreshments at a party

held at the Y.M.H.A. for men of the Royal Canadian Air Force. This brought forth much appreciation and we are indebted to Mrs. Bronfman and those who assisted her in this good work. We co-operated in the addressing of the sugar-rationing cards by providing 100 workers under the chairmanship of Mrs. Simon Rubin with the co-operation of Mrs. Jack Fitch and Mrs. Ned. Gross. High praise was expressed and merited for this particular service. As hospital service in itself must be evaluated as a vital wartime effort, we are nevertheless happy whenever our energies permit us to give further service.
